Call for Papers

The IASLIC 30th National Seminar 2024 will be organised in collaboration with the Department of Library & Information Science, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh, India and is scheduled to be held at the Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, during November 21-23, 2024.

Information literacy (IL) was impressively articulated by the American Library Association (ALA) through their professional rhetoric such as the Final Report of ALA, Information Literacy Standards and Information Literacy Models of learning outcomes etc. This early rhetoric is the most widely accepted articulation and rationale for IL that continues to provide a framework for discourse in the new age of information. In the other words, IL is knowing when and why one needs information, where to find it, and how to evaluate, use and communicate in an ethical manner. The concept of Information Literacy was built upon decades long efforts of the library professionals to help users to learn about and how to utilise the resources of their Library/Information Centre. With the emergence of new technologies, information literacy skills enable individuals to navigate the vast informational landscape effectively. At this juncture, Library/Information Centres should indicate analytical and critical skills among its user community to formulate search queries and to evaluate the results, and skills to search, to identify, access to a variety of information types to meet the information needs. In pursuance of IL standards and IL models, libraries/information centres would enlighten its user community to cope with the new age requirement of sustainability and lifelong learning. Emphasising the ongoing importance and impact of Information Literacy in the society, IASLIC has selected 'Information Literacy for Developing Enlightened Library/Information User Community in New Age' as the main theme of its 30th National Seminar 2024 expecting fruitful outcomes out of the deliberations and discussions. In addition, when IL is discussed, IASLIC feels, differently abled users should be encouraged to take part by satisfying their information needs overcoming all barriers. Assistive technologies could bridge the gap emerged due to digital divide among such people in the society. At the same time, the application of artificial intelligence would raise the library service quality. Thus, there will be deliberations on these two themes at the meetings of SIG01 (Social Science Information): Bridging the Information Gap of Differently-abled Library Users and SIG02 (Computer Applications in Libraries): **Raising Library Service Quality through Appli**cation of AI during the conference. Full research paper within 2500 words (not more than 10 pages of A4 paper-size), along with an informative abstract (between 300 and 400 words), typed in double space on single side, in Times New Roman 12pt font size, with margin of 1.5" on all sides should be submitted in **duplicate (hard copy) by August 07, 2024.**
- 3. Authors' declaration in prescribed format for the Seminar must be signed by all author(s) sequentially and submitted along with the full paper indicating distinctly the sub-theme and topic of the paper.
- 4. Declaration by the author(s) should be made separately in a hardcopy that the paper has not been sent elsewhere for publication/ presentation.
- 5. Softcopy of the full paper composed in .doc / .docx format should be submitted as an attachment through e-mail to iaslic.sem@gmail.com .

The 353rd Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC: A brief report

The 353 rd Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC was held on 11th July, 2024 (Thursday) at 6:00 pm in the meeting room of IASLIC which is situated at P291, CIT Scheme 6M, Kankurgachhi, Kolkata -700054. The speaker of the said study circle meeting was Dr. Sanjukta Mitra, Librarian, Rani Birla Girls' College, Kolkata. The Chairperson of the aforementioned study circle meeting was Prof. (Dr.) Swapna Banerjee, Professor of the Department of Library and Information Science, University of Calcutta. The topic of discussion was as follows :- "Information dissemination through the archives of Kolkata." First of all, Mr. Abhijit Kumar, the General Secretary of IASLIC, has delivered the welcome address. After that Dr. Tridib Chattopadhyay, the Convenor of the Study Circle Division introduced both the Chairperson and the Speaker. Then the Chairperson and the speaker both were felicitated with the flower bouquet by Miss. Moumita Ash, the Joint Secretary of IASLIC. Dr. Sanjukta Mitra stated that Kolkata is the hub of cultural and historical evidence as it once acted as India's capital during the British period. Once the Imperial Record Office during the British period is now our West Bengal State Archive. But, apart from state archives Governmental records, there are a lot of varieties of treasures kept in various types of archives, which need to be worked under a single umbrella. It has also been discussed by Dr Mitra that about 52 unique types of archives surveyed by her and data collected, present in the heart of the city. Their strength, weakness, objectives and barriers were also discussed by her. Prof Swapna Banerjee has summarised the entire lecture and she has also pointed out the important aspects of the discussion. Then the question/ answer and discussion took place. Dr. Banasree Roy, the Joint Secretary of IASLIC delivered the address of vote of thanks. Dr. Tridib Chattopadhyay, the Convenor of the Study Circle Division of IASLIC thanked all the members, professionals and dignitaries present in the session. The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.

The paper submitted should be an unpublished document in any media and of any format. While the copyright for the paper would belong to the author, PLANNER 2024 organisers reserve the right to host a copy of the papers in its institutional repository in open access.
