The IASLIC 30th National Seminar 2024 will be organised in collaboration with the Department of Library & Information Science, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh, India and is scheduled to be held at the Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, during November 21-23, 2024.

Information literacy (IL) was impressively articulated by the American Library Association (ALA) through their professional rhetoric such as the Final Report of ALA, Information Literacy Standards and Information Literacy Models of learning outcomes etc. This early rhetoric is the most widely accepted articulation and rationale for IL that continues to provide a framework for discourse in the new age of information. In the other words, IL is knowing when and why one needs information, where to find it, and how to evaluate, use and communicate in an ethical manner. The concept of Information Literacy was built upon decades long efforts of the library professionals to help users to learn about and how to utilise the resources of their Library/Information Centre. With the emergence of new technologies, information literacy skills enable individuals to navigate the vast informational landscape effectively. At this juncture, Library/ Information Centres should indicate analytical and critical skills among its user community to formulate search queries and to evaluate the results, and skills to search, to identify, access to a variety of information types to meet the information needs. In pursuance of IL standards and IL models, libraries/information centres would enlighten its user community to cope with the new age requirement of sustainability and lifelong learning. Emphasising the ongoing importance and impact of Information Literacy in the society, IASLIC has selected 'Information Literacy for Developing Enlightened Library/ Information User Community in New Age' as the main theme of its 30th National Seminar 2024 expecting fruitful outcomes out of the deliberations and discussions. In addition, when IL is discussed, IASLIC feels, differently abled users should be encouraged to take part by satisfying their information needs overcoming all barriers. Assistive technologies could bridge the gap emerged due to digital divide among such people in the society. At the same time, the application of artificial intelligence would raise the library service quality. Thus, there will be deliberations on these two themes at the meetings of SIG01 (Social Science Information): Bridging the Information Gap of Differently-abled Library Users and SIG02 (Computer Applications in Libraries): Raising Library Service Quality through Application of AI during the conference. The paper should not exceed 3000 words and contain an abstract of 100-200 words.

The main title should be followed by the name, affiliation, and address of the author(s) with e-mail.

The paper should be in MS Word format, with a Times New Roman font size of 12, space of 1.5 lines, A4, keyword of 2-5 words, and paper length of 3-8 pages.

All references should be presented according to the APA Style

The paper should be sent with the declaration letter stating that the work is original and not presented/published anywhere else.

Papers approved by the conference review committee will be accepted for the oral presentation.

#### **Proceedings**

After the 6th NACML-2025, the Organizing Committee proposes to bring out proceedings in e-book format with ISBN, which will include only the selected papers presented in the conference after plagiarism check using Turnitin similarity index software.

IASLIC has instituted a national level Smt. A Satyavathi and Prof. AAN Raju – IASLIC Best Young LIS Teacher Award since 2008, sponsored by Prof. A A A N Raju. Eligibility criteria for the nominees of Smt. A Satyavathi and Prof. AAN Raju –IASLIC Best Young LIS Teacher

- i. The candidate must be a Citizen of India and a member of IASLIC continuously for at least five preceding years to the year of the award.
- ii. The candidate must be within 40 years of age (valid age proof must be submitted)
- iii. The candidate must be employed in the post of a fulltime teacher of Library and Information Science at a UGC recognized Indian University / Deemed University

- / Institute recognized by the Government of India on permanent and regular basis against a substantive post.
- iv. The candidate must have at least eight years of continuous service in a full time teaching post.
- v. The candidate must possess a master's degree in Library and information Science or equivalent qualification obtained from a UGC recognized university/deemed university or an institute recognized by the Government of India.
- vi. The candidate must have a good academic record at bachelor's degree and master's degree levels (or at second semester and fourth semester examinations in case of two-year integrated master's degree course) in library and information science.
- vii. The candidate must be known for his ability as a teacher.
- viii. The candidate should have published, as a single author, at least 5 papers in peer-reviewed journals.
- ix. The candidate shall be a valid member of at least two registered and recognized professional associations a state level and a national level besides IASLIC.
- x. A member of the Executive Committee of the IASLIC shall not be eligible for submission of nomination his/her candidature for the award and/or propose or second nomination for any award.
- xi. An awardee of this category shall not be eligible to file his/her nomination for the same award on any subsequent occasion.
- xii. The candidate's nomination has to be proposed by two valid members of IASLIC and also seconded by two other valid members of IASLIC by affixing their signatures on the nomination paper in prescribed format.

Note: (1) If no candidate is found suitable for the award (i.e. score is less than 60%) by majority of adjudicators in a particular year, the award will not be given in that year. (2) Nominations for the award will not be considered if at least three nominations are not received in a year and the award will not be given in that year.

### Prof. Prabir Roychoudhury and Smt. AmitaRoychodhury –IASLIC Best LIS Teacher Award

IASLIC has instituted a national level Prof. Prabir Roychoudhury and Smt. Amita Roychoudhury – IASLIC Best LIS Teacher Award, sponsored by Prof Prabir Roychoudhury and Smt. Amita Roychoudhury Memorial Fund, since 2008.

Eligibility criteria for the nominees of Prof. Prabir Roychoudhury and Smt. Amita Roychoudhury" – IASLIC Best LIS Teacher Award:

- i. The candidate must be a Citizen of India and a member of IASLIC continuously for at least ten years preceding to the year of the award.
- ii. The candidate must be above 50 years of (valid age

- proof must be submitted).
- iii. The candidate must be employed in the post of a fulltime teacher of Library and Information Science at a UGC recognized Indian University / Deemed University / Institute recognized by the Government of India on permanent and regular basis against a substantive post.
- iv. The candidate must have at least fifteen years of service in a full time teaching post and at the time of nomination must be teaching at master's degree level and engaged in research/research guidance.
- v. The candidate must possess a master's degree in Library and information Science or equivalent qualification obtained from a UGC recognized university/ deemed university or an institute recognized by the Government of India and must have a good academic record at bachelor's degree and master's degree levels (or at second semester and fourth semester examinations in case of two-year integrated master's degree course) in library and information science
- vi. The candidate should be known for his/her scholarship and teaching ability.
- vii. The candidate should have published, at least 10 papers, including at least five papers as the single author in peer-reviewed journals published from the country with ISSN number or abroad.
- viii. The candidate must have organized national / international seminars / conferences and /or contributed to national/international seminars / conferences in the form of presentation of at least ten papers and / or editing seminar / conference publications.
- ix. The candidate shall be a valid member of at least two registered and recognized professional associations a state level and a national level besides IASLIC.
- x. A member of the Executive Committee of the IASLIC shall not be eligible for submission of nomination for the award and/or propose or second nomination for any award.
- xi. An awardee of this category shall not be eligible to file his/her nomination for the same award on any subsequent occasion.
- xii. A candidate's name has to be proposed by two valid members of IASLIC and also seconded by two other valid members of IASLIC by affixing their signatures on the nomination paper in prescribed format.

Eligibility criteria for the nominees of Librarian of the Year Award:

- i. The candidate must be a Citizen of India and a member of IASLIC continuously for at least ten years preceding to the year of the award.
- ii. The candidate must be above 50 years of age (valid age proof must be submitted).
- iii. The candidate must be employed as librarian or in an equivalent post in a permanent and regular establishment in a library or information center or the like of an Academic Institution / Research Institution / Central of State Ministry / Central or State Government Department / Corporate Units/ Public library.
- iv. The candidate must have at least fifteen years of service in full-time professional post.
- v. The candidate must possess a master's degree in Library and information Science or equivalent qualification obtained from a UGC recognized university / deemed university or an institute recognized by the Government of India and must have a good academic record at bachelor's and master's levels (or at second semester and fourth semester examinations in case of two-year integrated master's degree course) in library and information science.
- vi. The candidate should be known for his/her new ideas and innovations and technical / managerial skills in identifying, locating, collecting, organizing storing and designing information service.
- vii. The candidate must have published at least ten papers pertaining to library and information science, including at least two as the single author, in peer reviewed journals brought out in the country with ISSN member or abroad.
- viii. The candidate must have organized national / international seminars / conferences and /or contributed to national/international seminars / conferences in the form of presentation of at least ten papers and / or editing seminar / conference publications.
- ix. The candidate shall be a valid member of at least two registered and recognized professional associations a state level and a national level besides IASLIC.
- x. A member of the Executive Committee of the IASLIC shall not be eligible for submission of nomination for the award and/or propose or second nomination for any award.
- xi. An awardee of this category shall not be eligible to file his/her nomination for the same award on any subse-

quent occasion.

xii. A candidate's name has to be proposed by two valid members of IASLIC and also seconded by two other valid members of IASLIC by affixing their signatures on the nomination paper in prescribed format.

Note: (1) If no candidate is found suitable for the award (i.e. score is less than 60%) by majority of adjudicators in a particular year, the award will not be given in that year.

(2) Nominations for the award will not be considered if at least three nominations are not received in a year and the award will not be given in that year.

- Impact area 1: Libraries are connected and energised through vibrant, global professional communities
- Impact area 2: Libraries are recognised, represented and valued as partners
- Impact area 3: Libraries are enabled to deliver meaningful change at all levels
