Call for Papers

The IASLIC 30th National Seminar 2024 will be organised in collaboration with the Department of Library & Information Science, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh, India and is scheduled to be held at the Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, during November 21-23, 2024.

Information literacy (IL) was impressively articulated by the American Library Association (ALA) through their professional rhetoric such as the Final Report of ALA, Information Literacy Standards and Information Literacy Models of learning outcomes etc. This early rhetoric is the most widely accepted articulation and rationale for IL that continues to provide a framework for discourse in the new age of information. In the other words, IL is knowing when and why one needs information, where to find it, and how to evaluate, use and communicate in an ethical manner. The concept of Information Literacy was built upon decades long efforts of the library professionals to help users to learn about and how to utilise the resources of their Library/Information Centre. With the emergence of new technologies, information literacy skills enable individuals to navigate the vast informational landscape effectively. At this juncture, Library/Information Centres should indicate analytical and critical skills among its user community to formulate search queries and to evaluate the results, and skills to search, to identify, access to a variety of information types to meet the information needs. In pursuance of IL standards and IL models, libraries/information centres would enlighten its user community to cope with the new age requirement of sustainability and lifelong learning. Emphasising the ongoing importance and impact of Information Literacy in the society, IASLIC has selected 'Information Literacy for Developing **Enlightened Library/Information User Communi**ty in New Age' as the main theme of its 30th National Seminar 2024 expecting fruitful outcomes out of the deliberations and discussions. In addition, when IL is discussed, IASLIC feels, differently abled users should be encouraged to take part by satisfying their information needs overcoming all barriers. Assistive technologies could bridge the gap emerged due to digital divide among such people in the society. At the same time, the application of artificial intelligence would raise the library service quality. Thus, there will be deliberations on these two themes at the meetings of SIG01 (Social Science Information): Bridging the Information Gap of Differently-abled Library Users and SIG02 (Computer Applications in Libraries): Raising Library Service Quality through Application of AI during the conference. - 2. Full research paper within 2500 words (not more than 10 pages of A4 paper-size), along with an informative abstract (between 300 and 400 words), typed in double space on single side, in Times New Roman 12pt font size, with margin of 1.5" on all sides should be submitted in **duplicate** (hard copy) by August 07, 2024.
- 3. Authors' declaration in prescribed format for the Seminar must be signed by all author(s) sequentially and submitted along with the full paper indicating distinctly the sub-theme and topic of the paper.
- 4. Declaration by the author(s) should be made separately in a hardcopy that the paper has not been sent elsewhere for publication/ presentation.
- 5. Softcopy of the full paper composed in .doc / .docx format should be submitted as an attachment through e-mail to iaslic.sem@gmail.com .
- For bibliographical references and citations, contributors are required to follow strictly the IASLIC Authorship Manual including Standard and

- 7. The paper should be accompanied with an amount of Rs 1000.00 (Rupees one thousand only) as non-refundable paper submission fee. Librarians' Day 2024 jointly organized by IASLIC, BLA & WBPLEA: A brief report

Indian Association of Special Libraries and Information Centres (IASLIC), jointly with Bengal Library Association (BLA) and West Bengal Public Library



Employees Association (WBPLEA) observed **Librarians' Day 2024** to commemorate 132nd birth anniversary of Dr S R Ranganathan on 18 August, 2024 at Shivananda Hall of The Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture, Golpark, Kolkata. The inaugural session was started with a welcome song. Then

a condolence message was read by Dr Joydeep Chanda, General Secretary, Bengal Library Association which was followed by one minute silence. Mr Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary, IASLIC, welcomed the participants who have come not only from Kolkata and neighboring areas but also from different parts of West Bengal. In his address, Mr Kumar mentioned how Librarians' Day Celebration was started in 1990 following a decision at JOCLAI Meeting held at the Jaipur IASLIC Conference in 1989. He also highlighted the role played by IASLIC in organizing Librarians' Day in West Bengal, jointly with BLA and WBPLEA. Dr Joydeep Chanda, General Secretary, Bengal Library Association (BLA) gave a brief account of activities of BLA and also announced the ensuing Centenary Celebration Programs of the Association. Mr Saugata Saha, General Secretary of WBPLEA gave a brief account of present condition of public libraries in West Bengal and elaborated with the help of statistics the existing vacant positions of various government libraries. He also expressed his anxiety over future of public library system in West Bengal. In her inaugural speech, Prof Tapati Mukherjee, former Vice Chancellor of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University, Purulia expressed her thanks to three associations IASLIC, BLA and WB-PLEA. She emphasized on the duty and responsibility of the librarians to improve reading habit among peoples of the society. Quoting from Rabindranath and remembering the five laws of Ranganathan, Dr Mukherjee said that there are some similarities between their sayings related to books and library. Then 'Librarians' Day 2024 Souvenir' was released by Prof Krishnapada Majumder, President of BLA. A publication of BLA entitled "Viswabharati-Santiniketan Library Ebong Ek Annyo Rabindranath" written by Sukumar Das was released by Prof Tapati Mukherjee. In his address, Shri Sukumar Das, Professional assistant, Viswabharati Library expressed his gratitude to Bengal Library Association. In his Presidential Address, Prof Krishnapada Majumder mentioned the contributions of Ranganathan in the field of library science and library profession. Ranganathan will be remembered as a teacher, researcher, national professor, philosopher and author of many good books, Prof Majumder said. The inaugural session was anchored by Ms Moumita Ash, Joint Secretary, IASLIC. The inaugural part was followed by a discussion on the topic "Is Recreational Reading a Time Waste?" Swami Suparnananda, Hon'ble Secretary, The Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture was present as Chief Guest and in his address he emphasized the

role of mind on reading, learning, delivering address, teaching, orating, writing etc. The discussion on the topic "Is Recreational Reading a Time Waste?" began with a speech by Mrs Nandita Bagchi, Renowned Litterateur. Expressing her thanks to BLA, IASLIC and WBPLEA, she described the term 'recreational reading' and how 'recreational reading' helps one to motivate in good work, creative work. According to her, through recreational readings one can overcome the fatigues of mind and body. Mrs Bagchi also shared her experiences about libraries like Alexandria Library, Boston Public Library and New York Public Library. Prof Anil Acharya, Renowned Writer & Publisher, 'Anushtup', in his speech shared some experiences which he gathered as college teacher. He is worried about decreasing of reading habits among students. Delivering on the topic, Prof Acharya very nicely described the term 'recreation' and how a reader recreates the author's creation through reading. He emphasized on reading books from the very childhood days and said that 'will-force of reading' as well as 'will-force of hearing' are important components for smooth living in this world. Prof Shyamal Chakraborty, Former Professor, University of Calcutta and renowned science writer said in his speech that recreational readings are enjoyed by all. According to him, science writings are recreational literature and in this connection he took references from autobiographical book of Richard Feynman, entitled "Surely You're Joking, Mr Feyman". Prof Chakraborty stated the contributions of Upendra Kishore Raychaudhury, Sukumar Ray, Satyajit Ray, Sukhalata Rao, Lila Majumder, Promoda Ranjan Ray and Nalini Das in the literary world specially in children literature and recreational literature. He also mentioned contributions of Raja Rammohan Roy and Akshay Kumar Datta in science literature. Prof Chakraborty also said the role of libraries and librarians in encouraging independent reading to enhance literacy. He also welcomed all associations to move together for the survival of libraries. The technical session was moderated by Dr Binod Bihari Das, Former Chief Librarian, Jadavpur University, Kolkata. In his concluding remarks, Dr Das emphasized on the duties and responsibilities of librarians so that a readinglearning and cultural environment will exist Finally, the vote of thanks was proposed by Mr Nirmalya Ray, Joint Secretary, BLA. Altogether 450 LIS professionals attended the program.

with Indian Association of Special Libraries & Information Centers (IASIC, Kolkata, South Zone) jointly organised National Librarian's Day 2024 on the occasion of the 132nd birthday of Padmashri Dr S.R Ranganathan on 14th August 2024 at 3.00 PM. On this occasion, the CUTN has invited Prof. B. Rameash Babu, Commonwaalth Fellow (Loughborough University) and former Professor, Department of Library & Information Science, University of Madras as a special guest to deliver a theme talk on 'Dr Ranganathan's legacy on Indian LIS Profession'.

The programme commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Taddi Murali, Head, DLIS, CUTN followed by an introduction by Dr. K. G. Sudhier, Assistant Professor, Department of Library & Information Science, Central University of Tamil Nadu and Vice President of IASLIC, Kolkata, about the resource person Prof. B. Ramesh Babu, a distinguished figure in the field of Library & Information Science in the country. Through Google Meet Prof Ramesh Babu interacted with students, research scholars, faculties and the senior professionals across the country, who have attended in an online session organized by the department. Prof. B. Ramesh Babu gave an insightful talk about Dr. S.R Ranganathan and how his contributions have forever changed the course of the librarianship profession in India. He further elaborated the teachings of Dr. S.R Ranganathan such as 'Five Laws of Library Science', 'Colon classification' systems that are still relevant in the present day LIS profession and how it helps to open up platforms for new research ideas. Prof. B. Ramesh Babu also indicated the reason for deteriorating quality of LIS profession in India is due to the failure of implementing Dr S.R Ranganathan's teaching and recommendations in the modern day librarianship. He also mentioned that as library professionals, we are obliged to carry on his legacy and we must expand the horizons of librarianship by inculcating the values of Dr S.R Ranganathan.

Dr. V K Dhanyasree, Assistant Professor, DLIS, CUTN gave concluding remarks by summing up the speech of the guest of honour. Dr. Anila Sulochana, Assistant Professor, DLIS, CUTN delivered a vote of thanks to the dignitaries and participants. Dr. K. G. Sudhier, Vice President, IASLIC thanked everyone who attended the librarian's day celebration, especially the students, research scholars of the department and all other LIS professionals across the country. Grand Celebration of Librarians' Day by GIET School of Pharmacy: A brief report



On the occasion of the 132nd birth anniversary of Dr. S.R. Ranganathan, known as the father of library science in India, the Library Department of GIET School of Pharmacy celebrated National

Librarians' Day. The event commenced with the college principal, Dr. M.D. Dhanaraju, garlanding the portrait of Dr. S.R. Ranganathan. In his speech, he emphasized the importance of libraries for knowledge, research, and reading.
