360th Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC

The 360th Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC was held on 20th March 2025 (Thursday) at 6.00 pm in the meeting room of IASLIC which is situated at P291, CIT Scheme, 6M, Kankurgachhi, Kolkata- 700054. The speaker of the above-mentioned Study Circle Meeting was Dr Abhijit Chatterjee, Librarian at Seth Anandram Jaipuria College. The Chairman of the meeting was Prof. Biplab Chakrabarti, Former Professor, of the Department of Library and Information Science, University of Calcutta, Kolkata, West Bengal. The Topic of the discussion of the said meeting was “Managing Security in Academic Libraries: The Truth and Realities”. In the beginning, Mr. Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary of IASLIC welcomed all the dignitaries, guests and audience. Thereafter Dr Tridib Chattopadhyay, Convenor of the Study Circle Division, IASLIC, introduced the Speaker and the Chairman of the session. Afterwards, the Chairman and the Speaker were felicitated with flower bouquets by Miss Moumita Ash, Joint Secretary of IASLIC. Then Prof. Chakrabarti gave an overview of the issues of security threats in academic libraries highlighted the prime issues and invited Dr Abhijit Chatterjee and present his lecture on the issue. Dr. Chatterjee in his lecture shows how academic libraries face significant security challenges in safeguarding both physical and digital resources while maintaining accessibility. He mentioned that key threats include theft, vandalism, data breaches, and unauthorized access, impacting the integrity of collections and user safety. Libraries must balance security with user convenience, ensuring a welcoming environment while protecting valuable resources. The categories of physical and digital threats are vulnerable to academic libraries. Research findings on this issue of security showed the least security measures in most of the university libraries of West

Bengal. The speaker also presented several Myths about library security which have been properly justified through the explanation. A proactive, multi-layered security approach through a policy framework was also presented in the lecture. It is expected that it is crucial to maintain academic libraries as safe, trusted spaces for learning and research. Prof. Biplab Chakrabarti has briefly described the entire discussion. Shri Abhijit Kumar, Miss Moumita Ash and others took part in the discussion and question-answer session. The vote of thanks was delivered by Dr Banasree Roy, Joint Secretary of IASLIC. Dr Tridib Chattopadhyay, Convenor of the Study Circle Division of IASLIC thanked all the dignitaries, guests and the audience regarding their active participation and involvement. The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.

attending offline and 170 joining online. The insights provided by the speakers encouraged participants to explore innovative research, seek patent protections, and contribute to the nation's technological advancement.

Workshop on Redefining Libraries in the Era of AI –A brief Report

The Learning Resource Centre at IMT Nagpur successfully conducted a two-day workshop titled "*Redefining Libraries in the Era of AI*" on March 21-22, 2025. The workshop aimed to provide librarians with knowledge and practical exposure to AI-driven innovations in library management. These resource persons shared their expertise through insightful lectures and hands-on sessions, helping participants explore ways to integrate AI into library operations effectively.

The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Mangala Hirwade, Head, Department of Library & Information Science, RTM Nagpur University. The Valedictory Session was graced by Dr. Rajnandan Patnaik, Senior Dean - Academics, and Dr. Janaki Ramudu, Dean - Research, who appreciated the participants' engagement and emphasized the need for continuous learning in AI adoption for libraries. Key highlights of the workshop included an introduction to AI applications in library science, hands-on training on AI tools for content management and research support, interactive discussions on AI ethics, challenges, and future implications, case studies on successful AI adoption in library settings, and networking opportunities for librarians and AI experts.

The workshop was conceptualized and efficiently managed by Dr. Mantha Raghu, Head-Librarian, IMT Nagpur, along with his dedicated team: Amarjeet Kaur, Vilas Yemde, Jagdish Pande, Suresh Thakre, and Kiran Chatap.

The workshop received highly positive feedback from participants, who expressed their appreciation for the well-structured sessions, practical exposure, and insightful discussions. Participants highlighted the significance of AI-driven solutions in enhancing library services and requested similar initiatives in the future. The workshop successfully met its objectives, providing librarians with valuable knowledge and practical insights into AI's role in modern library management.

such workshops annually to keep pace with evolving technology and strengthen professional development opportunities for library professionals.

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS

One Nation One Subscription –ONOS

The Prime Minister of India in his address to the Nation from the ramparts of the Red Fort on 15th August, 2022, had pointed out the importance of Research and Development in our country in the Amrit Kaal. He had given the clarion



call of **“Jai Anusandhan”** on the occasion. The National Education Policy, 2020 (NEP 2020) has also identified research as a corequisite for outstanding education and development in our country.

In response to the vision of making India Atmanirbhar and Viksit Bharat@2047, the Government of India approved One Nation One Subscription scheme to provide country-wide access to international high impact scholarly research articles and journal publications to students, faculty and researchers of all Higher Education Institutions managed by the central government and state governments and Research & Development Institutions of the central government.

The One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) intends to acquire national licenses for e-journal/database subscriptions from most of the prominent journal publishers. A total of 30 major international journal publishers have been included in ONOS. All the journals published by these publishers will be accessible to the students, faculty members and researchers of the participating institutions.

The initiative will open a goldmine of knowledge available in top quality scholarly journals to nearly 1.8 crore students, faculty members, researchers and scientists of all disciplines, including those in tier 2 and tier 3 cities, thereby encouraging core as well as interdisciplinary research in the country. The ONOS is starting its operation from 1st January 2025. ONOS Phase-I has been approved for the calendar years 2025, 2026 and 2027. Access to journals are being provided through national subscription

coordinated by the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, an autonomous inter-university centre of the University Grants Commission (UGC), Gandhinagar, Gujarat.

The Department of Higher Education, Government of India will have a unified portal “One Nation One Subscription“ (<https://www.onos.gov.in/>) through which the institutions will be able to access the journals. The ANRF will periodically review the usage of One Nation One Subscription and publications of Indian authors of these institutions. One Nation One Subscription is a timely step towards establishing India in the global research ecosystem by bringing ease of doing research to the doorstep of all students, faculty members and researchers in the government institutions. IFLA Strategy 2024-2029

IFLA has designed a document to take IFLA through its centenary in 2027 and almost up to the end of the United Nations’ 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. It is strongly rooted in the input provided by the global library field. Through a series of surveys and workshops, it was learnt about how to use their Strategies, which issues mattered most for the people, and what IFLA all wanted to see in 2029.

These led the Governing Board towards a document that:

Makes a clearer connection between what we do and the results we want to see

Is more easily adaptable and adoptable by library and information workers, libraries and library associations globally

Underlines the role of libraries as development actors, working to enable their communities

The Strategy has a new and clearer **vision**: Sustainable futures for all through knowledge and information. It also focuses on three **impact areas**:

Impact area 1: Libraries are connected and energised through vibrant, global professional communities

Impact area 2: Libraries are recognised, represented and valued as partners

Impact area 3: Libraries are enabled to deliver meaningful change at all levels

This work is underpinned by the **enabler**:

Future-Proofing IFLA: Ensuring IFLA’s governance, projects, and partnerships are effective, transparent, and innovative. The Strategy is available at <https://repository.ifla.org/handle/20.500.14598/3497> one can find a set of indicators that will help us and you track progress.

Dr Rajesh Singh, University Librarian, Delhi University Library System (DULS), University of Delhi has been awarded the prestigious ILA - Kaula Best Librarian Award 2024 for his outstanding contributions to the Library and Information Science profession.

OBITUARY

Prof Harsha Shantilal Parekh, Former Head of SHPT School of Library Science and Former University Librarian, SNDT Women’s University, Mumbai passed away on 17 March 2025 at the age of 81. Born on 1 August 1943, Prof Parekh had her higher education all through from University of Bombay. An M A, M Lib Sc with Diploma in Russian Language, Prof Parekh started her professional career as Research Assistant in 1966 at the Department of Civics and Politics, University of Bombay, Mumbai. In 1970 she joined SHPT School of Library Science, SNDT Women’s University, Mumbai as Lecturer. She became

Deputy Librarian of SNDT Women's University in October 1984. In February 1993 she became University Librarian of SNDT Women's University, Head of SHPT School of Library Science and served till her superannuation in August 2003. She contributed immensely for the growth of academic librarianship and LIS education throughout the country. Prof Parekh wrote a good number of research articles and published in professional journals. In addition, she wrote a book titled "The Study Centre: It's Role in the Community". She also compiled and edited some publications viz. "Women's Study Index", "Guide to Women's Studies", "Catalogue, Theses and Dissertations, SNDT Women's University, Bombay". She was a life member of ILA, IASLIC, IATLIS, Library Association (London). Besides these professional bodies, she was also associated with the Social Service League, the Bombay Community Public Trust and Centre for Women and Development Studies. Prof Parekh's death is a tremendous loss to the LIS community which creates a void in the library fraternity. IASLIC deeply mourns her death and extends heartfelt condolences to her family.

Dr Brahmanda Pratap Barua, Former Director, Raja Rammohan Roy Library Foundation (RRRLF) breathed his last on 25 February 2025. Born on 15 October 1935 at a village in Chittagong district (now in Bangladesh), Dr Barua did his primary education in his village and passed Matriculation Examination in 1951. After passing IA and BA, he obtained MA degree in History from the University of Calcutta in 1957. He also obtained B Lib Sc in 1973 and Ph D in 1985 from University of Calcutta. Dr Barua joined the RRRLF as Field Officer in 1975 and became Member Secretary of RRRLF in 1977. He became the First Director of RRRLF in 1984 and served till his superannuation in 1995. With a broad national vision, he extended activities of RRRLF throughout all states and union territories

where more than 22000 libraries were brought under the assistance program of RRRLF. Dr Barua was the Member Secretary of the Committee on National Policy on Library and Information System (NAPLIS) appointed by the Ministry of Human Resource Department, Government of India under the Chairmanship of Dr D P Chattopadhyay in 1985. The RRRLF organized several conferences and seminars under his guidance in collaboration with the National Library of India, Asiatic Society, NCERT, ILA and other national institutions. Dr B P Barua was a life member of ILA, IASLIC and BLA. He was a member of the Standing Committee of the IFLA on Public Libraries for the period 1981 - 1995. He was the President of All India Federation of Bengali Buddhists, Kolkata. Dr Barua was honoured by his friends, colleagues and well wishers by publishing a Festschrift volume entitled "Public Libraries in Developing Countries: Status and Trends" edited by Dr P K Mahapatra and Dr V K Thomas and published by Vikas Publishing House, New Delhi in 1996. He was felicitated by the University of Calcutta in 2007 on the occasion of its 150th Anniversary. Dr Barua's passing away is a loss to the library fraternity. IASLIC deeply mourns his death and extends heartfelt condolences to his bereaved family.
