## THE MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is heartening to note that the 8th Central Pay Commission is inviting suggestions from various associations representing different categories of government employees for finalizing its recommendations. The members of the IASLIC may recall that the Fourth Central Pay Commission (1986) had made wide ranging recommendations regarding staffing pattern, restructuring of libraries and constitution of a Central All India Library Service (Group B). The recommendation pertaining to the creation of an all India library service has not been implemented through the Commission had observed that the total number of positions in libraries available was adequate to constitute the proposed service.

In pursuance of recommendations made in the Fourth CPC and to order to bring uniformity in pay scales and service conditions of librarians working in government libraries, a Review Committee was constituted by the government. A Categorisation Formula was adopted by the government in the year 1990. According to this formula, libraries were to be graded as Category 1, Category 2, Category 3, Category 4 etc. On the basis of their collection, services offered and use by their specialised clientele. The highest Category, i.e., Category 6 was reserved for the National Library, Kolkata. The staff structure of various categories was also prescribed but the government did not implement the staff structure. On the basis of this formula, many departments/ministries, upgraded the pay scales of librarians heading the libraries. Many autonomous bodies under the government also upgraded the positions of librarians. However, implementation of the categorisation formula was not uniform. Many libraries were left out as categorisation exercise was not undertaken by the administrative ministries and departments. In certain cases the recommendations made in the categorisation reports were not implemented.

The Categorisation Formula adopted by the government in 1990's has now become outdated due to advancement in information and communication technology (ICT) and its application in libraries. The Ministry of Culture had rightly decided to revise the categorisation formula. The progress made so far on this front is very slow and unsatisfactory. There are other relevant issues like revision/replacement of Delivery of Books (and Newspapers') Act, 1951, vacant (deputation as well as direct recruit) positions in libraries due to non availability of candidates in the feeder grade; and enormous delay in advertising the positions by the administrative ministries, UPSC, and the SSC. Non-revision of recruitment rules based on the recommendation made by the earlier pay commissions is also a limiting factor. In fact, different pay scales (basic and grade pay) admissible in universities and colleges prescribed by the UGC has resulted in very few opportunities for government librarians to get deputation tenures in academic and research institutions' libraries.

Moreover promotional avenues for government librarians are very few. They are identified as isolated professional staff. Though the Assured Career Advancement or financial upgradation scheme (i.e., 10, 20 and 30 years of service) has removed stagnation to a certain extent, the opportunities to get a higher position is severely limited in case of librarians working in government departments.

The General Secretary, IASLIC has recently sent a letter to the Member Secretary of the Central Pay Commission to consider these pending issues while finalising the recommendations. We believe, in the changed scenario, the government in the state of West Bengal will consider the recommendations made by the Central Pay Commission while finalising the pay structure and other benefits of the librarians working in state government establishments.

### 'Application of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in libraries', 26<sup>th</sup> April 2026 : Report and Analysis

#### Report

Indian Association of Special Libraries and Information Centres (IASLIC) has organised an online workshop cum training on 'Application of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in libraries' on 26th April 2026 from 10:00 to 13:00 hrs. The resource person was Dr Sukhdev Singh, Former Dy Director General, NIC, India. He is now an AI expert in India, especially in library applications. Seventy-six participants from across India have registered and actively participated in this workshop. Dr Sukhdev Singh covered the overall application of AI tools and techniques, especially libraries and research. He practically showed how professionals can classify, catalogue documents, and import them into the Koha application in the age of AI. He enumerated the advantages of AI tools and techniques for researchers, ranging from literature surveys to analysis. He also mentioned some drawbacks and cautioned against applying AI tools and techniques. The workshop began with opening remarks from Dr P. R. Goswami, President, IASLIC. Dr Banashree Roy, General Secretary, IASLIC, briefed participants on

IASLIC activities and also invited all participants who are not members of IASLIC to join as members. Dr Susanta Kumar Senapati, Coordinator, Education Division, conducted the workshop, while Dr Biswaranjan Manna, Coordinator, Information Division, IASLIC, provided full-fledged IT support for this workshop. At the end, a vote of thanks was presented by Mrs Monali Mitra Paladhi, Jt. Secretary, IASLIC.

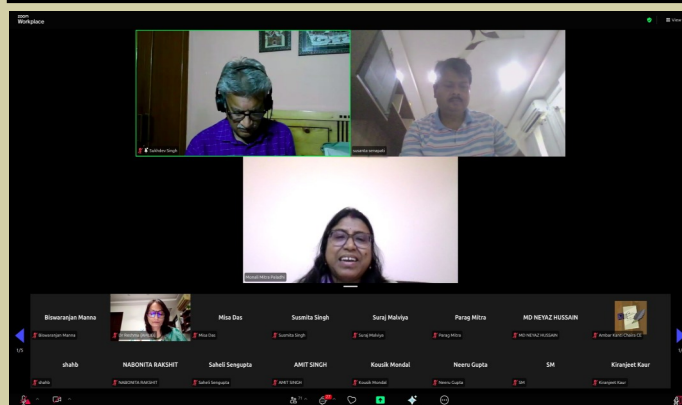
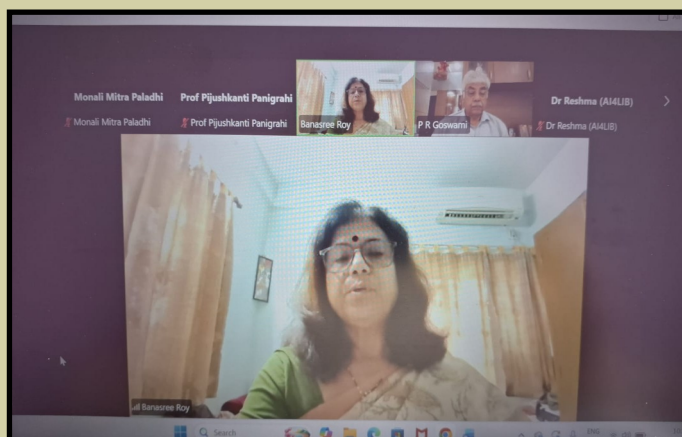
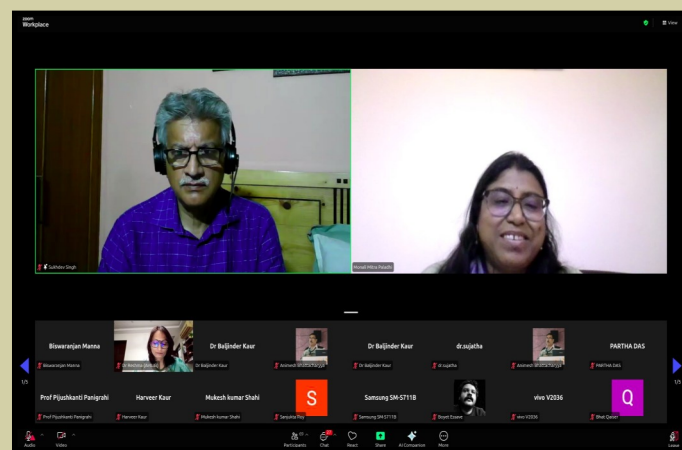

#### Planning & Realization:

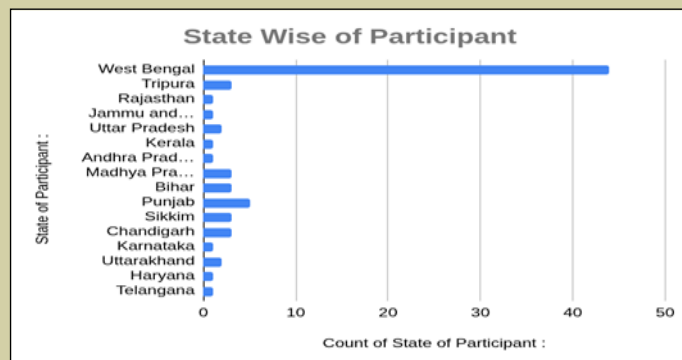
- a) Topic chosen and contacted suitable resource person for his consent, date and time;

#### Analysis and Findings:

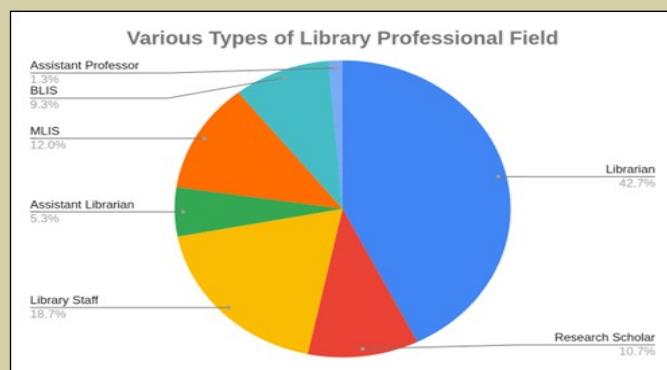
The following finding has been drawn on the basis of registration form and feedback from the participants.

1. Geographical Representation: 76 candidates were participated from all over the country. Out of 76 participants 44 from the West Bengal and rest 32

from different states in India. The state wise representation shown in chart no.1

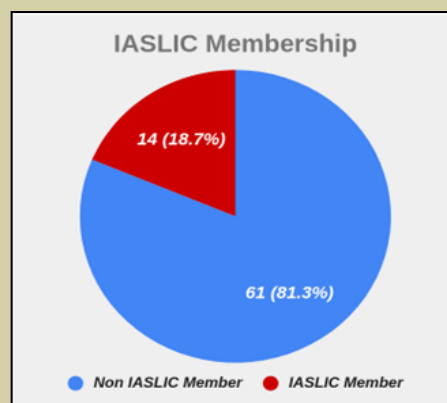


2. Different categories of LIS participation: On the basis of their designation and working place, it has been divided into three categories like Teaching faculties (Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant professors), practicing librarian (Librarian/Dy. Librn./Assistant Librn, PA/TA/ L&IO/LA/others) and students (Res. Scholars/Master and Bachelor of



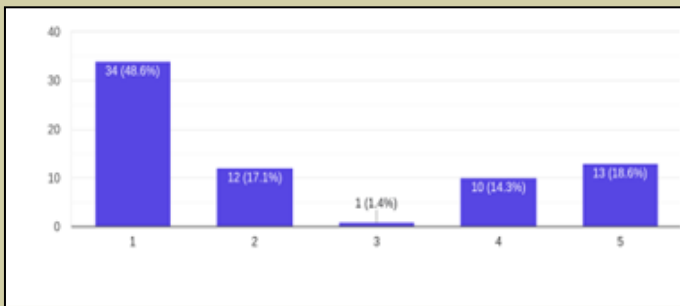
LIS/ Diploma/Certificates) among the 76 participants. The details on chart no 2.

3. IASLIC & Non IASLIC Members: Categorized into two segments i.e. IASLIC and non IASLIC members among the 76 participants. Found 18.7% participants were from the IASLIC members and 81.3% from the non IASLIC members. Chart no.3.

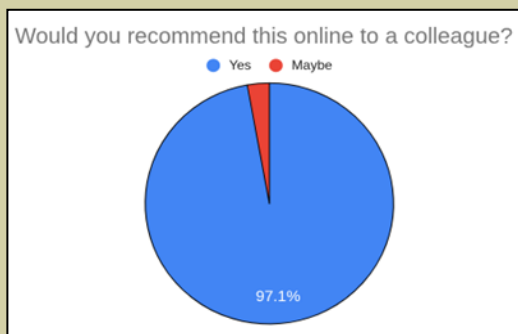


Other observations have been drawn on the basis of feedback received from the 70 number of participants:

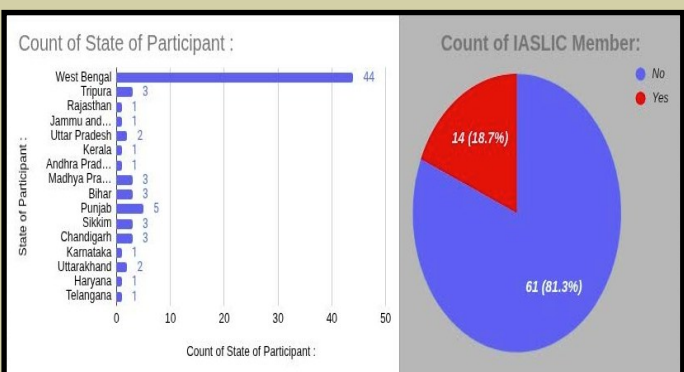
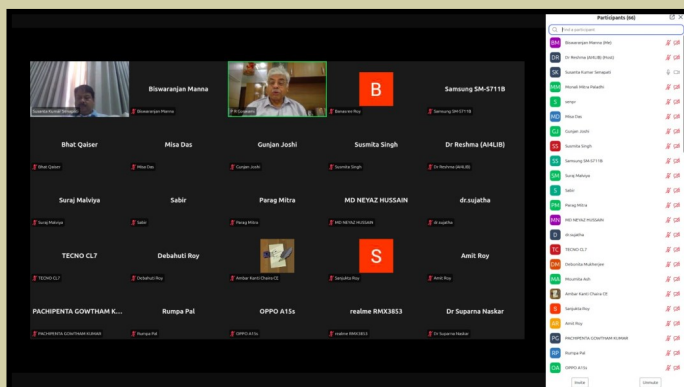

### International Conference on Librarianship

The International Conference on Librarianship is scheduled to be held in Kolkata. The West Bengal College Librarians' Association (WBCLA), in collaboration with Vidyasagar Metropolitan College and in association with Vidyasagar College, will organise a two-day International Conference on "Librarianship in Transition: Problems, Challenges and Prospects" along with the XXXVII Annual General Meeting (AGM) of WBCLA on June 27 and 28, 2026, in Kolkata. The conference will be held at Vidyasagar Metropolitan College and Vidyasagar College, located at 39 Sankar Ghosh Lane, Kolkata. Eminent librarians, academicians, researchers, and information professionals from India and abroad are expected to participate in the event. Prof. (Dr.) Ajay Pratap Singh, Director General of the National Library of India, will attend as the Chief Guest, while Dr. Arun Kumar Chakraborty, Professor of Library and Information Science at Netaji Subhas Open University, will serve as the Conference Director. Prof. (Dr.) Nevzat Ozel, Department of Information and Record Management, Ankara University, Turkey, will serve as the Chairman of the International Advisory Board. Furthermore, Prof. (Dr.) Pijushkanti Panigrahi, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Calcutta, will serve as the Chairman of the National Advisory Board. According to the organisers, the conference aims to discuss the rapid transformation of academic libraries in the age of digital technology, artificial intelligence, open access initiatives, and changing user expectations. The programme will provide a platform for scholarly exchange, policy discussions, and collaborative learning on the future of librarianship in India. The conference will cover a wide range of themes, including digital transformation in libraries, ICT applications, Indian Knowledge Systems, information literacy, research support services, library policies, artificial intelligence, digital preservation, and social inclusion through libraries. Several distinguished scholars and professionals from India, Bangladesh, Turkey, Singapore, and other countries are expected to deliver lectures and present research papers during the event. The organisers have invited research papers, case studies, and conceptual papers from librarians, academicians, researchers, students, and LIS professionals. The last date for abstract submission is May 30, 2026, while the conference registration deadline with paper submission is June 15, 2026. Dr. Sanat Kumar Biswas, General Secretary of WBCLA and Convener of the conference, stated that the event would strengthen professional collaboration and help address

contemporary challenges faced by academic libraries and librarians in the digital era.

## Obituary

### Heartfelt Tribute to Dr. Muttayya M. Koganurmam



The news of the demise of **Dr. Muttayya M. Koganurmam** on 30 May 2026 at 11:12 p.m. has brought profound sorrow to the Library and Information Science fraternity. His passing marks the loss of an eminent scholar, distinguished librarian, visionary educator, and dedicated mentor whose invaluable contributions have left an enduring impact on the profession.

His mortal remains brought from Bengaluru to Lakshmeshwar, and the last rites performed on Sunday, 31 May 2026, at 4:00 p.m. at the Rudrabhumi crematorium in Lakshmeshwar, in accordance with the rituals and traditions of the Veerashaiva-Lingayat faith.

Although he is no longer with us physically, he will continue to live in our hearts through his knowledge, service, achievements, and enduring contributions.

Dr. Koganurmam was born on 1 June 1953 in Ichangi village, Savanur Taluk, Dharwad District. Despite growing up in modest circumstances, he pursued education with unwavering determination and dedication, ultimately achieving remarkable success in the field of Library and Information Science.

He earned his B.L.I.Sc. and M.L.I.Sc. degrees from Karnataka University and was awarded a Gold Medal in M.L.I.Sc. He later obtained a Master of Science in Information Management from the University of Sheffield, England, and earned his Doctorate from Karnataka University.

Throughout his distinguished career, he served as Librarian, Professor, Dean, and Director General at several prestigious institutions, including the National Institute of Technology Karnataka (Surathkal), Tata Institute of Social Sciences (Mumbai), Jawaharlal Nehru



University (New Delhi), Central University of Gujarat (Gandhinagar), and Basava Samithi, Bengaluru. Through these roles, he mentored and guided thousands of students, scholars,

and professionals. His contributions to library modernization, digital libraries, information technology, knowledge management, and information services were immense and far-reaching. He enriched the profession through numerous research publications, books, seminars, workshops, and national and international conferences.

His achievements were recognized through several distinguished honors, including the “*Suvarna Kannadiga-2025*,” “*Samaja Seva Ratna*,” and the “*ILA Lifetime Achievement Award*.” His simplicity, dedication to service, and commitment to the dissemination of knowledge made him a role model for generations of library professionals.

His demise in Bengaluru at the age of 74, following



illness, has caused profound grief. A great teacher, an exemplary librarian, a cherished friend, and a compassionate human being has fallen silent today. He is survived by his wife, son, daughter, brothers, sisters, relatives, colleagues, and countless friends and admirers.
